
Just in case, Vice Chairman Lee Townsend, who had baked two Date and walnut cakes from his Nana's 70, year old

How are we doing?

38,000 successful call outs completed by us all and we're averaging 12,000 a year. When you consider we did 812 in the first year, 5 years ago, it's astounding. That's a lot of miles done by our Riders, a lot of phone calls and texts received and sent by our Controllers and a lot of money raised by our Fundraisers.

How many people we've helped get diagnosed, made better even saved, we don't know. What we do know is that we've saved the hospitals a fortune and we've made some good friends, what more can we ask?

3 Sisters? Total wash out

Each year we have had an event at 3 Sisters Race Track in Wigan and this year was set to be no different. Wigan Councillor Bob Brierly, looks after the track.

There was fear a few months ago when the firm running the business there went bust, but they didn't own the track, Wigan Council do. Bob took it upon himself to get it running again and the Council have bought a few dual seat Go-Karts so that Dad & kids can go on together or the disabled can be chauffeured around the track at break-neck speed (well fast anyway).

We arranged for the second Tuesday in August, (the second Tuesday in each month is when they open the track to charities). Of course, riding a bike around a race track in wet weather is not ideal so in the interest of safety we abandoned it.

Thanks to everyone who came along ready to help. We have been offered another couple of dates, 23rd August or 13th September, but it is unlikely we will be there this year.

New Bikes

Many of you will know that we have had issues with Yamaha, which still haven't been fully sorted, but suffice it to say we are not happy with Yamaha.

Thanks to Aviva and our member Ian German, we were able to purchase not 2, but 3 new Honda Cross Runners from North West Honda at Blackpool discounted to us allowing us to buy 3. NW Honda already supply us with a Cross Runner every 6 months.

The very latest addition is the very last Honda ST1300 in the Country again arranged via NW Honda, but paid for by the Rotary clubs across the North West.

Malcolm Baldwin, was the District Governor for all clubs in Lancashire and Cumbria and his charity for his year in office was North West Blood Bikes. In May 2016 Malcolm asked me how much a new bike would cost fully kitted and at that time we were looking at buying another Yamaha, which would come to us at £14,000 fully kitted, but like anything else the prices rise. Added to this is the dispute with Yamaha, so it was agreed to go for this Honda Pan European, beautiful bike, but I'm very biased as I've owned Pan's since 1995.

The Rotary raised over £17,000 which in agreement with Malcolm, will not only buy the bike and kit it, but also run it for a year. So, a Massive THANK YOU to the Rotary.
