## From a Controller: Who the public don't see, but who we can't do without

## **Driving Licences (Over 70)**


Some of us are over 70, but still active and enjoying Riding & life. Those of us who cherish our Driving Licences for both Bikes and Cars, should have a look at this from DVLA:

Basically, due to Coronavirus an extension to a driving licence for the over 70's, which only lasts for 3 years, when it has to be renewed, has been extended for a period to allow for the application and renewal of an existing licence during this pandemic. You MUST still apply before the expiration of the licence anytime from 90 days prior to it running out.

To all Rider members, don't forget if you renew your licence for any reason, including the Photo expiration date. Please let the Membership Secretary know, when you change.
