This BMW is named Marcel in memory of Marce I Falloon, who sadly passed away suddenly during the night several years ago.


(Ed: Such a lovely man and brother of member Colette Falloon, who took up motorcycling because of him.)

For Information:

Many people don't know what the markings are on their tyres, and remember tyres are your only contact with Mother Earth when on a bike or in a car. They must not only have a good tread, they must be suitable for your bike or car. Advice from the tyre specialists, "Don't mix makes or type".

Dates on tyres: Their 'Date of Birth' is written on the tyre sidewall. Look for the four-digit code. The first two figures represent the calendar week in which it was

made (from 1 to 52) and the second two figures are the year of manufacture. So, a code of 1316 would mean your tyre was made between 28th March and 3rd April 2016.

Ed: Having been on extensive tyre courses at both Dunlop and Michelin I will only ride a bike with a repaired tyre to get me home, then it's a new tyre. A car is different because there's four \odot .
