10th Anniversary Celebration


Hopefully you can't fail to have missed that it is our 10th Anniversary Celebration which takes place on 21st October at Garstang Country Hotel and Golf Club.

Fleet Update

We have just taken delivery 2 new BMW R1250 RT LE's which are currently in preparation by Fleet manager Paul Pain ready to be brought into the fleet after being run in and conducting their 500-mile service.



You may wonder what work needs to be done to transform a brand new bike below into a Blood Bike? The extensive list includes fitting of a Tracker for location and speed, high visibility graphics and livery fitted, camera systems for the front and rear, engine and rear crash bars, and of course a custom rack designed to accept the red "daniels" and boxes of blood .

We also have a new Honda NT1100 in service which is currently in use for test purposes in the Central. This will return to HQ this week for evaluation by West region as well. We intend to get feedback from all areas so look out for a message from your Area Manager. So far the NT1100 has performed very well with no adverse comments and plenty of feedback on how it can be improved once aftermarket accessories become more widely available for this model.

Finance Update

Our charity continues to be financially robust and it is hoped that the recent increases in the mileage rate paid to those using their own vehicles will help them as they continue to assist the NHS.

A significant donation has recently been received from Mrs June Hart amounting to £15,000 for the purchase of a new bike in memory of her husband

Over £3,867 so far been raised by the Just Giving page in memory of West member Steve Davy's, and £2,000 from the Infocus magazine on the Fylde.
