# **Region Fundraising Events**



You may have seen the FaceBook post submitted by Fylde Rider Mick Steel recently to announce that, further to his application some months ago, we have been chosen to be one of the charities which will partner with the Lytham Festival this year (2023). Subsequent to finding out we were one of the successful out of the 68 applications, Mick attended a PR event on 18th April 2023.

Lytham Festival is one of the biggest events on the calendar for the North West, attracting over 100,000 visitors to the Fylde coast over five days and it partners with five charities, selecting a specific charity for each night of the event. NWBB-LL is very fortunate to have been selected as the charity partner for the final night of Sunday 2nd July 2023, when DEF LEPPARD and MÖTLEY CRÜE are appearing live. # It's What We Do

In much of what we do there is very little feedback on the patient treatment process that is going on behind our work. We take anonymous sealed bags from A to B as required. Very occasionally there is a little bit more visibility of the part we play. That was the case recently for rider Frank Barker in West.

At the outset it seemed a "normal" call - blood sample Ormskirk to Southport. But there was to be far more. A patient in Ormskirk needed a transfusion and a specialist technician at Southport had to analyse the sample and validate the appropriate blood products as suitable.

" I was asked to wait at Southport for that process to be complete, then take the approved blood back to Ormskirk for the patient. All done with the blood up on the ward within an hour. Just shows how valuable and efficient our service is" said a delighted Frank.

It's what we do - dedicated personal service absolutely free.

#### **NWBB** is even more Advanced

The Committee were delighted that membership figures presented at the AGM showed a 38% increase over the last year in the number of our riders who have an advanced qualification. Overall, the percentage of advanced riders has risen from 62% in 2022, to our current 82%. This is a great tribute to the calibre and commitment of our members to be safe and among the very best on our roads. NWBB is continuing its encouragement and promotion of Advanced training and qualification, with a £75 bonus to those who successfully gain a pass. Riders and drivers should talk to their Area Manager to get approval.

### **Controller News**



Unknown to some, Controlling is not limited to our usual hours of duty. The assistance of NWBB to facilitate the transport of urgent medication, equipment and samples etc, during midweek days or very late hours are not unusual, but is a vital part of what we do. Situated as we are on the M6, we are often called upon to help organise and participate in countrywide relays with as many as 6 other blood bike groups. Destinations have included Inverness, Edinburgh, Cardiff, Bristol, Porton Down, London, Exeter and anywhere in between.

In particular, our help in transporting FMT's (Faecal Microbiota Transplants) from Birmingham City University Hospital Microbiome Centre, to all points North has been much appreciated by our friends at Shropshire Staffordshire and Cheshire Blood Bikes SSCBB, with the additional assistance from D&GBB and BB Scotland. This year we have delivered six 'time sensitive' FMT's.

This treatment for C. Difficile, after early clinical trials, is proving remarkably effective, hence the increase in these requests from around the country. Let's also not forget the work of Paul Pain and Janice Marsh who coordinate the collection and distribution of Donor Breast Milk in our area. They can call upon a small team of volunteer rider/drivers that also give their time during the day to collect from Preston to deliver to various Neonatal Wards in each of our areas. #### **Alan Hart**

Most of you will not have known Alan Hart so we wanted to share more about his story.

Alan was a Health & Safety & Quality consultant and travelled extensively to India, Greece, Turkey, Australia and the Philippines before joining Lancaster & Morecambe College which involved some teaching in Barrow Shipyard. Alan's classes were always well attended and students were disappointed if a substitute teacher arrived.

Outside work Alan was a keen fell walker, a very safe companion and competent in all weathers. He was also very interested in steam trains and a highlight was a trip on the Trans-Siberian Railway with son, Simon.

In the 1970's Alan and his wife June started the Heron Hill Free Church, holding services at their home for several years before moving to Kendal Leisure Centre and then in the 1990's to the Heron Hill Community Centre. Alan led the Church until 2012 and June is still very involved.

Alan was diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2016 and had treatment at Rosemere and then Lancaster. He always remained positive and was convinced that he was going to beat it. He died peacefully at home on Heron Hill in Kendal at the end of 2019.

In February 2022, June asked Colin Kendal at Northwest Bloodbikes to give a Blood Bike presentation to The Beck Community Centre Friendship Group which Sue Park and he attended with a liveried bike. The presentation was very well received and several members had a sit on the bike. As well as tea and cakes we received a generous donation of £164..

In August June contacted Colin again to say that she would like to sponsor a blood bike in Alan's memory. Colin also had a phone conversation with Jon, Alans son, and sent him photographs of our new "Peter" bike.

The new Alan Hart bike arrived just before Christmas and put into service during January 2023.

# **Finance Update**

Treasurer Martin was asked at the AGM for a breakdown of the spend that was shown in our presentation.

For each £1 NWBB spends:-45p looking after the bikes 22p to fuel the bikes and assist members using their own fuel 13p to insure the Liveried bikes 20p on HQ & administration

While we are a well funded charity, we are focused on spending our money wisely as you can see from the above. All members should also note that once again, unlike in previous years, nothing is now spent on legal costs.

#### Fleet News

A reminder for all riders on the age limits currently in place for the use of Liveried Bikes.

Age of 70 - the rider must be added to the fleet policy, and thereafter must have an assessment on or just after their 70th birthday no matter when their last assessment was. Every year thereafter, they must have a yearly assessment

Age of 75 - the rider must have a further assessment, and continue having a yearly assessment. The rider will be named on the charity fleet policy and complete a questionnaire from the insurance company. They have the right to say Yes or No, and may ask for a 'fit to drive medical' at the riders cost.

With these controls in place we are delighted to support our older riders, and ensure we are as inclusive as possible.
