Finance Update



After two difficult years in 2020 and 2021 our Charity has made an incredible financial recovery in 2022. Significant donations were received from the Eric Wright Charitable Foundation, Leyland Women's Golf Club and from the family of our dear departed rider, Russell Curwen. The post-COVID revival of fundraising by our brilliant Events Teams has made a huge contribution. We now have sufficient reserves to cover more than one year's running costs, which is remarkable for any charity. This has also enabled us to increase the allowances that can be claimed by our volunteers (should they wish to do so) to the maximum allowed by HMRC rules.

Fleet News



There have been a couple of incidents in recent weeks where boxes have unfortunately become separated from the carrying rack of the bike. One incident on a fleet bike, and another from a private bike. We have therefore reviewed our box securing procedures and a new video, starring Paul Pain, has been made and is available on the website. The straps are now to be placed place over the box before fitting the cover, and further secured with additional bungee, which will be issued to all riders in the New Year.
