A day chosen to celebrate ALL ladies involved (Controllers, Fundraisers, Committee Members, Riders and Supporters) within the many Blood Bike charities across the UK and Ireland.

The idea behind it, to raise money for NABB (although we're not members we still have a connection) and also to raise awareness of the work we all do for the NHS.

Initially, 100 places were allocated for the ladies for a guided tour around the National Motorcycle Museum in Solihull, however, given that it was Summer Holiday time it was a pretty big ask.

35 places were taken up and then places were opened up to the menfolk.

On the day Colm and I set off and met up with Christine Jones (Central). Grateful thanks to the Committee again for allowing me to take Amelia along. With numbers being so low, having a couple of liveried bikes made all the difference.





On arrival at the National Motorcycle Museum, it was introductions all round and then onto the guided tour.

The museum hosts, probably the greatest collection of British motorcycles dating from the late 1800's to fairly recent Triumphs. Great for motorcycle enthusiasts but also a good place to see our wonderful motorcycle heritage. Approximately 90% of the motorcycles in the museum are runners yet one of the most amazing bikes for me, was the *non-running* Brough Superior Golden Dream worth in the region of 1 million pounds!

After the tour it, there was a nice ride out to Lynn's Ravens Café in Whitchurch. Well worth a visit, this bike friendly transport cafe has full English Breakfasts served on plates the size of dustbin lids. Not a bad word to be heard



about the food and the staff were really friendly too.

All in all a very good day out, new friends made and awareness raised, along with just under £300 for NABB. I know we are no longer affiliated, but for me, that was never really an issue.

Media coverage was mentioned in the planning stages, with possible articles in women's magazines and aybe even a slot on "Loose Women" but sadly nothing came of it.


