# Chairmns bit...

A great deal has gone on recently, some have left of their own choice and some have had to leave, but many more have joined.

The Secretary of the charity has stood down, but remains a Trustee, in order to separate the Trustees and Committee, which will be complete at the latest in May 2019, because I am standing down as Chairman but will remain a Trustee.

The whole idea is to have a two tier system. The Committee are responsible for the day to day running of the charity and the Trustees are there to ensure the finances and legal issues are done correctly. It also means that if there is a disagreement between a member and the committee, the Trustees can deal with it independently, so it's fairer for all.

We are now, of course, in a position where we need a Secretary and an advert has gone out to members explaining what is required.

We are still ahead of all other Blood Bike Groups, in call-outs, and we have more volunteers than any other group. That said, we are always in need of more people because there is naturally a turn over, due to work, family, illness, etc., so please continue to advertise what we do. Our biggest area of concern is West, and as you know we are trialling using car drivers for the regular runs, and it's beginning to work, plus we have taken on some more riders.

It's also muted that Bolton and Wigan may be considering using us again, but don't hold your breath, we tried early on to help them, but they rarely used us, however I am informed there are some new people there.

This is to take dialysis samples from Bolton to Salford on Regular runs in the evening and at weekends. We're waiting to have a meeting with them" then **Watch this space**.
